JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU!

I keep telling myself that we are in the Easter season and not Christmas as I look out the window and see snow, hear of cooler temperatures, and keep looking for the signs of spring. We are in mid-April, and the joy of Easter continues. We need to keep looking forward and keep our eyes fixed on the Risen Lord. In the upcoming weeks we will celebrate First Holy Communion with our youth. We pray for them as they prepare to be renewed in the Spirit and prepare to receive Our Lord Jesus for the first time in the Holy Eucharist. Hopefully, it reminds all of us of the time we received these sacraments and how our eyes have been opened by the Spirit to see and serve the Risen Lord in all that we do.

In the recent week, I have brought back the distribution of Holy Communion under both species. I have noticed, however, some "near misses" when an Extraordinary Minister has to travel with the chalice to distribute the Precious Blood to someone in the pews. Because of the danger of spillage, Holy Communion will continue to be distributed under one species (Host) to those unable to come up to receive. Please keep in mind that when you receive Our Lord under one species, you still receive Him: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

Jesus says in today's gospel, "Why are you troubled? Why do questions arise in your hearts?" Our faith is deepened through the sacraments, and our youth remind us that God's love is always renewing and calling our parish community to walk closely with Our Lord. Is Jesus calling you to a deeper commitment this Easter Season to focus on your gifts and how you can share them within the parish community?

Continue to be blessed this Easter Season! May Jesus open our minds and hearts to understand the scriptures and affirm us in our mission.

And let us thank Almighty God for the blessings that He has bestowed upon us. He continues to bless us in many ways, and we look forward to the blessings yet to come as we "Trust in Jesus". Pray for the parish each day that we may be open to God's plan and know clearly where His plan will take us.

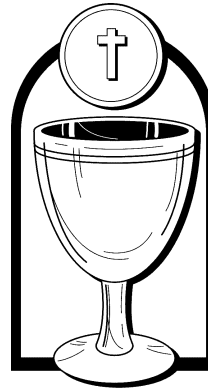
